

Moveable walls at London synagogue



At Alyth Gardens Synagogue, Style worked with two architects, dMFK and AMA, as well as Borrás Construction to create flexible space in the ground floor hall and the first floor multi-function space.

In both rooms, Style installed a Dorma Huppe Variflex moveable wall with semi-automatic operation and an impressive 55dB acoustic rating.

By being semi-automatic means the acoustic seals are applied to the correct pressure each time the wall is closed, ensuring optimal acoustic performance. The 55dB rating means concurrent events can take place either side of the wall undisturbed.

With integrated pass doors, there is ease of access between the sub-divided rooms and each wall is finished in a Camira Lazer fabric, with a simple white melamine on the door panels.

Michael Porter, Style's group managing director, said, "In this busy, vibrant synagogue, multiple events are constantly being hosted and the Variflex is very effective at creating flexible room space, with a vital acoustic barrier to ensure that these events can be enjoyed concurrently and without sound interference."
